

## Work Begun on New Links Layout at Lincoln Park

Present Course Will Be Divided Between  
North and South Eighteens.

The new golf course at Lincoln park is in the making. Work of clearing trees off ground on which the fairways will be laid out on the "south nine" was begun Wednesday.

All of the new 18-hole layout will be east of Grand boulevard and will stretch as far east as Twin Hills. In fact, when the course is completed, its eastern extremity will be just across the road from Keefe Carter's club.

Arthur Jackson, Lincoln Park pro and architect of the new course, explained Wednesday how it will fit in with the present 18-hole layout.

"Roughly speaking, the two courses will be the North and South eighteens," Jackson said. "The present course will be divided.

"What is now known as the first nine will be coupled up with all of the south half of the new layout. This will be known as the South 18 and the

starting hole will be at the present No. 1 tee.

"What is now No. 10 hole will become No. 1 of the North course, under the 36-hole plan. The present second nine and all of the northern half of the new property will form the North course."

Each of the two 18-hole layouts will measure approximately 6,400 yards when completed.

Par on the new holes has not yet been figured out but Jackson will have that information available in the near future.

Weather proving agreeable, the full 36 holes may be ready for use late in the 1931 season.
